The Nurse Family Partnership...

Is a program for women who are having their first baby. You will develop a partnership with a specially trained nurse, who will visit you during your pregnancy, and continue until your baby is two years old. During these visits your nurse will:

- Talk to you about your health during pregnancy
- Help you plan for the arrival of your baby
- Give you information about child development
- Teach you how to use the resources available in your community

During each visit you will be able to discuss your concerns and ask questions about pregnancy and parenting, the goals you have for yourself, and ways to involve your entire family in raising your child.



Planning for Care....

Although mothers are the most directly involved in the care of their baby, we know that many people are involved in raising children. Involving dads, extended family and even friends is very important when you are seeking help in raising your child.



Your Visit Schedule

Visits start while you are pregnant and continue until your child's second birthday. You and your nurse will agree on the day and time of each visit.



Joining this Program

The Nurse Family Partnership program is being offered in your community at no cost to you. In order to become a participant in this program you must be:

- Expecting your first baby
- Be in early stages of pregnancy (not later than the 28th week)
- Meet the program income guidelines
